2009/2010 CUC PFL Playoffs - Day Three

With the seasonally cool weather now a thing of the past, the young Primary Football League stars faced another hot day matched only by the heat of the action that was day three of the 2009/2010 CUC Primary Football League (PFL) Playoffs, which was played at the historic home of Cayman football - the T.E. McField Sports Centre (Annex Field).

Truth For Youth got the ball rolling with a 5-0 victory over Grace Academy in the U-9 Consolation Cup. Other scores included Cayman International School's 2-0 win over East End Primary and Montessori by the Sea's historic 1-0 victory over Savannah Primary; historic for Montessori in the sense that this was the school's first victory in the Playoffs in their debut season. For Savannah Primary, this result marked their first loss in the Playoffs after winning their previous two Playoff encounters.

In the U-9 Champions Cup, Bodden Town Primary defeated Cayman Prep 3-1; St. Ignatius Prep continued their unbeaten streak outlasting Prospect Primary 2-1; Triple C squeaked by George Town Primary 2-1 and Red Bay Primary created the first upset of the day downing John A. Cumber Primary 2-1. With two wins in the Playoffs, Red Bay Primary has their sights set on finishing in the top four and a spot in the semi finals on January 30. A win over George Town Primary next week ensures their progression.

In the only U-11 Consolation Cup game of the day, George Town Primary blasted five past North Side Primary although the boys from the northern district made it extremely difficult for the Towners by way of tenacious tackling and stubborn defending.

As the afternoon sun beat down on the hallowed ground, the action on the field intensified as the U-11 Champions Cup games commenced. Desperate for their first win in the Playoffs, Triple C faced an undefeated and confident John A. Cumber Primary team who had outscored their previous two Playoff opponents seven to one.

From the onset of this particular contest, it seemed a sense of complacency had somehow crept into the John A. Cumber Primary camp as Triple C took the lead early in the second half. The youngsters from the west equalized and the game seemed destined for a draw until a penalty was awarded for the Crusaders. Up stepped Isaiah “Leo” Ebanks to break the deadlock and secure Triple C’s first Playoff victory.

Other action in the U-11 Champions Cup saw Prospect Primary down Bodden Town Primary 2-0; St. Ignatius Prep defeat Cayman Prep 4-1 and Cayman International School beat Red Bay Primary 4-1.

Going into the final day of the Playoffs, which will determine the four semi final berths, John A. Cumber Primary top the U-11 Champions Cup group with 15 points followed by three teams - St. Ignatius Prep, Prospect Primary and Triple C - on 12 points. Sitting in fifth place with nine points and still with a chance of qualifying is Cayman International School.

The action continues on Saturday, January 23 at the Annex Field with the final games of the PFL Playoffs for all the Cups a week before the semi finals, which are scheduled for Saturday, January 30.
